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NET Health becomes a Medicare-Certified Diabetes Self-Management Education Program

Tyler, Texas (February 10, 2017) – The NET Health Center for Healthy Living was recently named an accredited diabetes education program by the American Association of Diabetes Educators (AADE), a National Accredited Organization (NAO), certified by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). This will allow the people with Diabetes in and around the Tyler area with increased access to high quality diabetes education services.

Diabetes education is a collaborative process through which people with or at risk for diabetes gain the knowledge and skills needed to modify behavior and successfully self-manage the disease and its related conditions. “AADE’s accreditation assures that an accredited program meets the National Standards for Diabetes Self-Management Education and Support,” said Leslie E. Kolb, RN, BSN, MBA, Accreditation Director for the Diabetes Education Accreditation Program. “Meeting this criteria shows that these high quality programs have been shown to improve the health status of the individuals who embrace the education, to modify unhealthy behaviors, or simply to provide the education that the person with diabetes has not previously received. This is exactly the type of community-based program that we envisioned when we set up our accreditation in 2009.”
